Board Improves Campus Landscaping

The campus was not spared the effects of the derecho last year. On the property north of Moundview Manor, which is reserved for a fourth building, the King of Kings Lutheran Church disaster recovery team and board members removed damaged trees and shrubs from the site. Several trees on other parts of the campus were damaged and were removed. After the stumps were removed, board members planted grass in the affected areas. Board members surveyed the campus in early summer and made suggestions to improve the campus. One of the ideas is a windbreak on the west of Moundview Manor to replace rows of arborvitaes trees damaged by the derecho. The Eden Project of King of Kings Lutheran Church will help with the planting of a fir tree windbreak at the end of August.

Churches Continue to Support MSLC

Through July the supporting churches have contributed \$13,629.20 to MSLC. Since the churches were first asked to help donate a match of \$60,000 to help build Moundview Manor, they have contributed \$487,332.60. The Board of Directors and the residents thank the churches for their support.
