Supporting Churches Donate to MSLC

So far this year, the supporting churches have donated \$14,341.30 to MSLC. Those dollars, as well as donations from individuals and businesses, support the efforts of the board to improve the campus and facilities. One of the areas needing improvement is campus landscaping. Two of the buildings on campus were built using Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding. Under HUD rules, the only landscaping which rent receipts can provide is lawn mowing. Board members recently planted several small trees north of Moundview Manor. The board also contracted with a landscaping company to replace perennials, weed beds, remove or trim overgrown shrubs, and replace trees destroyed by the derecho. Board members are also constructing a patio cover at Trinity Pointe. New signage was built at each building. The board is also looking at adding planters for use by residents at Scott Meadows and additional ones at Moundview Manor.
